Big Thank You To Daniel Albert At The Synagogue

Students of Studies of Religion 3 have all visited the Hobart Synagogue in Argyle Street to continue to further their understanding of Jewish beliefs, practices and the Shoah. Daniel Albert provided our students with knowledgeable and detailed knowledge relating to the Tasmanian Jewish community, the Hobart Synagogue itself and the historical, cultural and political context of the Holocaust.

Our Principal, Mr Craig Deayton has also visited classes to share his own study and understanding of the events surrounding the Shoah and the implications of the Jewish genocide in modern world history.

Street Retreat

This Thursday, we offered a Street Retreat experience to eight of our students involved with the Just Act committees on each campus. This experience began with some reflective understandings and preparations at the Hobart Campus Chapel, lead by Ms Sullivan and Mrs Prichard. Students then headed to Dining with Friends in Mathers Lane to assist in the preparation and serving of the monthly meal for those in need in the CBD. During the evening, students met with St Vincent de Paul personnel, social workers and helpers to become aware of the work of Vinnies to assist those at risk of being homeless and the homeless of Hobart.

Environmental Science

Last month, the Environmental Science class headed out into forests on kunanyi/Mt Wellington with Darcy Vickers from the Forest Education Foundation, to study contrasting forest types.

The first locations were in dry eucalypt woodland at Ridgeway, where the students surveyed and sketched the forest, identifying species and measuring abiotic factors such as light, wind speed, soil moisture, temperature and humidity. We then headed off to Fern Tree, where the students studied the tall wet eucalypt forest, noting the differences from the dry eucalypt woodland. In small groups, the students investigated rotting logs, tree hollows and the contrasting abiotic factors, and then presented their findings to the group.

We were lucky with the weather and enjoyed a great day out in the forests, where the classroom learning becomes real! Thank you, Darcy!

This was a great opportunity for students to have one-on-one conversations with UTAS representatives and get perspectives from UTAS students about certain courses.



It was a great week organised by our GYC Careers Counsellor Deb Winton with students gaining heaps of knowledge and a better understanding of Uni life!


