The large hand painted canvas labyrinth is modelled on the shape and scale of the Labyrinth at Chartres Cathedral in France. Labyrinths are not mazes where one gets lost or meets dead ends – a labyrinth is a guided pathway to a centre and then return – they are of ancient origin and in many forms across the globe. The exercise is completed in silence and each participant is able to just concentrate on walking calmly and mindfully throughout. This experience enabled students and staff to discuss different ways that they find calm and peacefulness in the midst of busy and stressful times. We encourage all our students to avail themselves of the tips provided in tutor and class to learn to relax during exam time. There are many apps on phones that can provide assistance with breathing exercises – Smiling Mind is one example. The benefit of good sleep, frequent breaks, exercise and good self-care are essential as exam time approaches.

ENGLISH EXCURSION

The Practical English and Essential Skills Reading and Writing Students have been exploring a unit on travel. This has included looking at travelling around Hobart and also the greater Tasmania area.

We have looked at modes of transport, accommodation, local attractions and the costs associated with these things. On a local level we planned a trip into Moonah for morning tea. In order to do this, we planned our travel on a metro bus, researched our morning tea venue and considered timings and the practicality of our trip. ARC NEWS

As we approach the end of the year, our focus in the ARC is how we can best support students through their final assessments. Along with offering a range of study spaces, we are also providing students with study planners, targeted assistance, and healthy snacks to help them during this busy and often quite stressful time.

This week we also launched our virtual ARC presence, ARC Online, a series of internal sites for staff and students to access our wide range of resources. Designed to streamline staff and student access to ARC services, one of the key features of our online ARC is an embedded search bar which enables users to quickly reach and search the ARC catalogue and other relevant databases. By reducing the number of clicks it takes to reach our resources, we hope to strengthen research culture within the school and develop students' digital literacy. The ARC Online has a suite of resources relating to "Study Skills and Literacy Support" – including sections on Exam Revision, VET Resources, and Academic Writing Assistance. In conjunction with GYC's Literacy Practice Leader, Michael Moses, we have also created a portal for students to upload drafts of their academic work for feedback before submission. This system replicates the services offered to undergraduate students and aims to not only help students improve their grades but also lighten the load for teaching staff.

Finally, as this is the last newsletter for the year, we want to warmly thank all staff and students for their support throughout the year and wish every success to those students who are in their very last weeks of school – best of luck!


